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Welcome! World History is a course required for graduation. World History is a survey course. Students will learn about the major themes of history, reoccurring patterns in history, major civilizations and revolutions. Since this is a survey course, a wide variety of topics will be addressed. There is a required state final exam called the NC Final (subject to change) that counts 20% of a student's final grade as mandated by the state or this could be a teacher made final that counts 20%. (subject to change).

Classroom Guidelines

Adherence to the following guidelines will insure a safe and enjoyable year for everyone.

Progress Reports

Interim reports will be sent home periodically throughout the term. Interim reports are to be signed by a parent and returned to the teacher. Grades may be accessed anytime online through Power Schools. Grades are updated at least every other week on Fridays.

Attendance

ABSENCES: Students are required to bring a note excusing their absence to the office when they return to class. If a student checks in after missing the class, it is their responsibility to come by and see what they missed and turn in what is due. If a student checks out before class, the same applies. A student is allowed 6 absences for the term. "A student shall lose credit for absences beyond six (6) unless the student makes up all work required by the teacher, completes the semester with a passing average (not counting the final exam grade), and makes a grade of 70 or higher on the final exam," per county policy.

Tolerance

The history curriculum requires the study of people with diverse cultures, viewpoints and religions. Discrimination and derogatory comments will not be tolerated. All students are expected to show respect to others, regardless of their race, ethnicity, sex, national origins, religious and cultural beliefs.

Academic Integrity Policy

Wilkes County Schools has an academic integrity policy. It is important that students and parents are familiar with this new policy. Students must turn in their own original work and if other sources are used, they must be cited.

Internet Access

Internet access at home is beneficial for this class. Assignments will be posted on Canvas and the class website. Internet access after school hours is helpful. If you have a problem with this, you may need to access the internet at school either before or after school.
